

<u>LETRS Training in alignment with</u> <u>the Excellent Public Schools Act of</u> <u>April 2021</u> (click link to view video)

- 2 year training process for K-5 teachers (approximately 30 hrs per semester - 4 semesters)
- Pre K; Principals involved for a year of training
- ***UPDATE: We are actively working our way through LETRS in TCS. School Admin continue to work on creative ways to maximize time for teachers, due to extra workload.

TCS Mental Health Update

- Hired a high school Crisis Counselor using ESSER funds
 - Coulter Burch, LCSW
 - Serves BHS, DRS, and RHS
 - Works in the same capacity as a school counselor; unless a referral is made and parents consent to ongoing therapy
- QPR Gatekeeper Training
 - Question, Persuade, Respond- Suicide Prevention
 - <u>About QPR</u>
 - Missy Ellenberger and Courtney Owen are now trained instructors and are certified to deliver QPR Gatekeeper Trainings
 - Feb. 24- RHS & RMS staff will receive QPR Gatekeeper training
 - Feb. 25- BHS, BMS, & DRS staff will receive QPR Gatekeeper training
- CARE Coalition Behavioral Health Survey
 - Survey was administered to students in grades 6-12 in the fall of this year
 - Waiting on results from CARE Coalition, should have those in the next couple of weeks

TCS Mental Health Update

- Youth Mental Health Mobilization collaboration
 - Introduced at the December 6, 2021 meeting, significant work has been accomplished since that time
 - Partnership with TCS, The Family Place, and the Health Department
 - Purpose: Every youth in TC feels confident and secure in connection, purpose, and hope
 - Leadership team: Rik Emaus, Missy Ellenberger, Elaine Russell, Erin Drew, Jen Heatherly, Leah Bush, & Tara Rybka (communications)
 - Steering committee for TCS: Missy Ellenberger, Adria Hardy, Shanaia Powell, Scott Strickler, Barbara Grimm, Sarah Shawver, as well as, 1-2 student delegates from each of the three high schools
 - Steering committees from each partner meet to begin the work of defining strategies and action steps to support the youth in TC.
