CTE Local Application


- The CTE Local Application System has been developed in compliance with Perkins V – The Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act.



- Farm Bureau Grant--We received \$1,200 from NC Farm Bureau to help with fence repair costs that were damaged during Tropical Storm Fred. The BHS FFA Farm houses animals on campus to use in our outdoor classroom environment for our Animal Science classes.
- Rosman High Agriscience Applications students assisted Rosman Elementary school students with repairs to the Fran Whitmire Garden damaged by the flood.
- Kentucky Community Service Trip. Mr. Harris took 5 FFA members to Kentucky for 5 days
 to help with cleanup efforts after the tornadoes passed through in December. They
 received local donations from small businesses of tools, equipment to help make the trip
 possible. They were also able to take a truck load of non-perishable items and clothing
 that was donated by local churches and organizations.






- NC Mountain State Fair Livestock show. BHS FFA participated and brought home several championships and class winners at the WNC Ag Center and NC State Fairgrounds in Raleigh. RHS FFA had a class winner and several mid class and top ten finishes
- This is our 5th year offering the Vet Assisting Honors class through the Animal Science pathway. Both BHS and RHS students can take this certification class as a senior and get a national certification to become a Veterinary Assistant. As of 2018, there have been 15 students certified as Veterinary Assistants from this program.



- Alumni Shade Wilbanks, a graduate of 2020, will receive her FFA National American
 Degree this year. The American Degree is awarded to FFA members who have
 demonstrated the highest level of commitment to FFA and their agriculture high school
 career and continues to succeed into college in an agriculture related program. Shade is a
 sophomore at the University of Mount Olive and is pursuing her degree in Agriculture
 Education. We are so very proud of her!
- The Culinary Arts program at RHS has established a school-based restaurant called Bistro de Bengala and hopes to expand to offer catering services next year.





Mrs. Clayton received the Governor's Education Discovery Award this year.
 She will receive a \$1,000 grant where she will attend Middle Tennessee
 University's Artificial Insemination of Cattle Course later this year. She will be able to use this certification to teach students the process and technique, as well as manage the AI method of breeding our cattle at the FFA Farm.
