Denmark Educational Exchange 2024 Board Meeting Approval Presentation

For the past 11 years, Brevard High School has participated in an international exchange with the Mariagerfjord Gymnasium high school in Hobro, Denmark. In 2013, 2015, 2017, 2019, and 2023, the students from Hobro came to visit BHS. They stayed with host families, attended school, and explored western North Carolina. In 2014, 2016, 2018, and 2024, teachers and BHS students traveled to Denmark to stay with host families, attend school, explore local areas, and visit historical sites. In 2020, the teachers and students were prepared to return to Denmark, but the global closures due to COVID necessitated the cancellation of the trip at the last minute.

It has all been a tremendous success, both academically and culturally. We look forward to the opportunity to continue this exchange by traveling to Denmark again in Spring 2026. This year, with your approval, we have the opportunity to host Danish students and travel to Denmark in the same year. The Danish students plan to arrive in Western North Carolina during the 1st week of February and stay for about a week. They will stay with BHS families and attend some classes. In turn, our students will have the same opportunity in Denmark. Some of our students may have the chance to host a student and then travel to Denmark and stay with that student's family.

We tentatively plan to leave on April 10th and return on April 18th, flying from Asheville to Copenhagen. We will spend 3 nights in Copenhagen, then take a train to Hobro to stay with host families. We plan to leave Hobro and fly out of Copenhagen early morning on Saturday, April 18th. Students and teachers will return to school on Monday, April 20th, after missing a total of 5 - 6 school days, depending on flight options.

The total cost is estimated to be between \$3,000 and \$3,500 per student. This cost covers airfare, travel insurance, hotels in Copenhagen, travel cards while in Copenhagen, train ride to Hobro and back to Copenhagen, group activities in Copenhagen and Hobro, and teacher chaperon flight/hotel/Train expenses. Any leftover money (which has been the case in previous years) is refunded to the parents. Not included in the cost is a minimum of \$500 for meals and other expenses.

I would ask the Board to allow us some flexibility with the itinerary so that we may pursue the best value and logistical options leading up to the purchase of airfare and lodging.

At this time, we have had interest from students and parents to go on the trip. We are planning on hosting a parent meeting at the end of September. Interested students will be given parental permission forms and teacher recommendation forms. Once these forms are returned, we will require an initial deposit of \$500 so that we may lock in numbers and begin formally making reservations
