In North Carolina, school grades are based on each school's achievement score, weighted 80%, and on students' academic growth, weighted 20%.

\*HS report card grade also includes Graduation Rate, Math Course Rigor, and ACT scores.






TCS -Grade Level Proficiency











Percentage GLP proficient by year...





Percentage **GLP** proficient by year...










Percentage **GLP** proficient by year...













#### **Rosman Middle**

Percentage GLP proficient by year...








### **Brevard High**

Percentage **GLP** proficient by year...









#### Rosman High

Percentage **GLP** proficient by year...







# Notable Highlights:

- BHS ranks #1 in the Western Region for traditional public high schools on ACT performance
- RMS tied in WNC as #1 for the growth index
- TCH earned a 26.3 point reading gain from 3rd to 4th grade.
- **BES** 4th grade reading cohort grew by 10%
- **PFES** earned 13.6 proficiency gain in reading from 4th to 5th grade.
- RES finished in the top 25% statewide on EOG math scores
- BMS earned a 6.5 reading gain in their 6th to 7th grade cohort.
- DRS maintained status and continues to increase their graduation rate.
- RHS Met Growth for overall HS measures



- GLOWS:
- All four schools ended the year strong in the foundational reading skills in first grade. The **proficient scores ranged from 72%-94% (PSF and NWF).** "A first grader who is an average reader by the end of first grade has a 9 out of 10 chance they will remain an average reader by fourth grade".
- BES in 23-24 EOY was 64% proficient K-3, 24-25 was 71%-7 points growth
- TCH's first grade students grew 17% from last year in kindergarten
- GROWS:
- Third grade had a 10% increase in proficiency from BOY to EOY in ORF ending at 63% proficient readers across the district.
- Implementation of a new strategy, Partner Reading Paragraph Shrinking at
   TCH & BES
- Continual march towards 80% proficient in all reading foundational skills


