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Scholastic Hardest Math Problem Challenge - Brevard Middle School

Each year, Scholastic releases three math problems (one per grade level) for students to solve. The Challenge has two stages. In Round 1, everyone can submit an answer. Students who solve their grade level's problem correctly then move on to Round 2, which involves solving an additional math problem and creating a written explanation about how to solve the problem. Students who answer the Round 2 questions correctly will have their names put into a drawing for a chance to win college scholarship money and prizes like laptops and tablets. Black History Month

Each February, U.S. schools celebrate Black History Month by honoring the contributions and sacrifices of African Americans and recognizing the cultural heritage, triumphs, and adversities that are an indelible part of our nation's history. In 1926, Dr. Carter G. Woodson, Black author and historian, set out to shine a light on the collective, shared experiences of all African Americans and show how those experiences have shaped, challenged, and strengthened America. What started as Negro History Week eventually evolved into Black History Month in the 1960s. Black History Month is celebrated in the month of February because two great men, Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass, were born in February. This year's theme, "Resistance," explores how African Americans have addressed historic and ongoing disadvantage and oppression.



February is Career and Technical Education Month

The month of February is recognized as National Career and Technical Education Month to highlight the value of CTE and the achievements and accomplishments of CTE programs across the country. Career and technical education directly prepares students for high-wage, high-demand careers in areas such as health care, information technology, advanced manufacturing, hospitality and management, and more. 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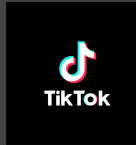
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
