The Transylvania County Board of Education met in regular session at 6:00 p.m. on February 18, 2010 at the Morris Education Center. The meeting had been rescheduled from February 15, 2010 due to inclement weather. Present were Chris Whitmire, Chairman; Tawny McCoy, Vice Chairman; Shelia Norman; Cindy Petit; and Sue Fox. Also present were Dr. Jeff McDaris, Superintendent; Jenny Hunter, Administrative Assistant; Norris Barger, Director of Business Services; Dr. Bo Williams, Director of Testing and Policy; David Sutton, Director of Human Relations; and Lenora Carver, *Transylvania Times*. Seth Aiken, Rosman High School, was the student representative. Mrs. McCoy gave the invocation and Mrs. Norman led the Pledge of Allegiance. Chairman Whitmire called the meeting to order.

Dr. McDaris introduced RHS student representative, Seth Aiken, to the Board. Mr. Aiken reported that high school students overwhelmingly prefer having Saturday make-up days, even if that means having six-day weeks, rather than lose Spring Break. Dr. McDaris stated that the cost of paying overtime for hourly and classified employees (cafeteria workers, office support, custodians, teacher assistants, and bus drivers) would prohibit holding Saturday school unless it occurs during a week in which one or more days have been missed. He agreed that Saturday school would be his preference rather than taking more days away from Spring Break. To date, ten days have been missed due to snow and ice. Two of the makeup days have been scheduled for the Monday and Tuesday of Spring Break leaving three days, Wednesday through Friday, remaining.

6. **Policy**

New Policy GBA "Professional Standards of Conduct and Performance for Teachers" was presented for a fourth read and possible action. Dr. Bo Williams reviewed the latest changes to the policy. He thanked Mrs. Fox and Mrs. McCoy for participating in the policy committee meeting that was held on January 19 and reported that the committee had voted to recommend the policy changes as discussed at the last board meeting. Mrs. McCoy shared an e-mail from a policy committee member which contained more suggestions. Discussion centered on the following:

Mr. Whitmire suggested the insertion of "strive to" in Line 8 to read, "Therefore, all teachers employed by the Transylvania County Board of Education shall strive to comply with and adhere to " Other members disagreed with making this

- change, indicating that expectations should be stated clearly and without ambiguity.
- Mrs. McCoy suggested a rewrite and combination of Items 4 and 5 to read, "Act in a professional manner toward co-workers and/or supervisors, which includes but is not limited to avoiding actions, conversations, or confrontations which undermine or diminish their authority or result in an instructional disruption."
 Members were in agreement with this change.
- The Board added a new item which addresses staff dress/appearance. The new items reads, "Dress in a professional manner appropriate to their assignments, and at no time violate the student dress code established by Board policy JFCE."

ON A MOTION BY MRS. PETIT, SECONDED BY MRS. FOX, Policy GBA was unanimously adopted as revised.

Dr. Williams presented revised Policy GD "Employees' Work Week and Overtime Compensation" for first-read approval. The revision makes Saturday the last day of the work week instead of the first day of the work week. Dr. Williams reported that the revision is needed in order to allow hourly and classified employees to work when school is in session on Saturday without violating the 40-hour work week/overtime laws. ON A MOTION BY MRS. FOX, SECONDED BY MRS. MCCOY, revised Policy GD was unanimously approved as presented. A make-up day will be held on Saturday, February 20.

Dr. Williams asked the Board for permission to extend the deadline for third round observations from March 1 (as written in Policy GCN/AFC-R) to March 8, 2010. The extension is required as a result of the number of instructional days missed. The change would impact this year only. The Board had no objection to the one-week extension.

Dr. Williams asked for a Board volunteer to serve on the 2010-2011 calendar committee. Mrs. Norman offered to serve as her schedule permits. The first calendar committee meeting is scheduled for March 10 at 3:30 p.m. at the Education Center. Mrs. McCoy conveyed compliments to Dr. Williams from a parent for his good work with the numerous calendar revisions this year. Mrs. McCoy also commended Dr. McDaris for not compromising student safety.

Dr. McDaris informed the Board that he is considering applying for a calendar waiver for the 2010-2011 school year. He stated that he does not expect the waiver to be granted, but feels the gesture is important to show the negative impact/limitations that state calendar law has imposed on mountain school districts. Chairman Whitmire suggested that the waiver list every early dismissal, delayed start and missed day so as to present the truest portrayal of the number of instructional disruptions that have been experienced this winter. Dr. McDaris thanked the *Transylvania Times* for publishing his articles explaining calendar changes. He gave a reminder that the only make-up options remaining are Saturdays, Spring Break, or extending June. He declared his intent to preserve at least a part of Spring Break as a much needed breather for students and staff. He stated that it is most unfair for mountain students to have to give up their spring breaks while students in the rest of the state get to keep theirs. Board members strongly agreed.

7. Facilities and FY11 Budget

Norris Barger gave a report from the State Finance Officers Conference held this week. State revenues have fallen \$35 million below predictions, and the state is looking at a \$400-500 million budget gap for next year. Additional state cuts for next year are a near certainty. Mr. Barger presented a revised list of anticipated current expense budget needs for FY11:

Board members discussed the list and other items that may be included at a later date based on actions by the State Legislature. Mr. Whitmire asked how many jobs could be endangered. Dr. McDaris stated that there is no way to know at this time. Much will depend on the state's expanded budget cuts, ADM reduction and other factors. Federal stimulus money goes away after next year. He reported that Martin Nesbitt had recently announced to superintendents that he would attempt to hold the discretionary reduction to the same level as it was this year. Mr. Barger predicted there would be no way to do this and also provide the teacher salary increase. Dr. McDaris reported that Mr. Nesbitt does not believe the teacher raise will happen.

The Board discussed at length the projects on the capital outlay priority list and suggested several changes. Mrs. McCoy expressed concerns about the BES generator and whether it is a school need or an emergency shelter need. Mr. Whitmire asked if it would be possible to fix the sound panels in the RHS gym in time for this year's graduation. Mr. Barger stated that the Board could choose to appropriate money from another area to do so. Mrs. Fox asked about playground fencing at PFES. Mr. Whitmire gave a reminder that big items such as the Education Center and football field should be shown in the presentation of capital needs.
