The Transylvania County Board of Education met in regular session on June 18, 2012 at 6:30 p.m. at the Morris Education Center. Vice Chair Tawny McCoy, Sue Fox, Shelia Norman and Cindy Petit were present. Also present were Dr. Jeff McDaris, Jenny Hunter, Dr. David Sutton, Alan Justice, Deputy Wesley Anders, and Jeremiah Reed, *Transylvania Times.* Mrs. Fox led a moment of silent prayer and Mrs. Petit led the Pledge of Allegiance. Vice Chair McCoy welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order. She reported that Chairman Whitmire was away on military duty.

1. <u>Approval of Agenda</u>

ON A MOTION BY MRS. FOX, SECONDED BY MRS. NORMAN, the meeting agenda for June 18, 2012 was approved as presented.

2. Public Comment

There was no public comment.

3. <u>Good News Report</u>

Dr. McDaris reported that the Transylvania County Schools Technology Department had recently submitted a letter of inquiry to the Golden Leaf Foundation requesting permission to complete a grant application for expansion of technology in the schools. The Foundation has responded to the LOI and invited TCS to complete a full application for funding consideration. The deadline for submission is June 21, 2012.

4. Former Students in the Military

The Board reviewed the list of former students from Brevard High School, Rosman High School, and Davidson River School who are currently serving or have previously served in the U.S. Military. There were no new names. Additional names will be included as they are received.

5. <u>Consent Agenda</u>

ON A MOTION BY MRS. NORMAN, SECONDED BY MRS. FOX, the minutes from the June 4, 2012 meeting and the personnel report for June 18, 2012 (attached) were unanimously approved as presented.

6. <u>Policy</u>

7. <u>Safe and Healthy Schools Update</u>

Alan Justice gave an update on safe/healthy schools:

- During the 2011-2012 year, TCS school resource officers made over 1700 official student contacts. In addition, they conducted more than 200 home visits and taught over 100 classes. Mr. Justice commended the SROs for their good work and stated that he looks forward to continuing this very beneficial program.
- Transylvania County Schools had 37 reportable offenses to law enforcement during 2011-2012. Most of those were for possession of weapons (typically pocketknives) or drugs. He attributed the low number of reportable incidents to the new student code of conduct, which gives principals and administrators more leeway in dealing with student behavior issues.
- There were a total of 200 short-term suspensions this year, which equates to approximately 6% for the system. Most of the suspensions occurred at the middle school level, and principals referred many of those students to the C-STOP program, where they could receive instruction during their suspension periods.
- Three-hundred twenty-five students were randomly drug tested this year. Out of that 325, only 14 tested positive for illegal substances. All of the 14 were high school students and each positive result was for marijuana. Mr. Justice stated that he is pleased with the current drug testing policy, and will review the policy this year to see if updates are needed. Mrs. McCoy observed that there has been much focus lately on prescription drug abuse by teens, which appears to be occurring outside of school hours and at places other than school. Dr. McDaris stated that prescription drug abuse is not so much a student problem as it is a community problem. Statistics show that a large number of prescription drug abusers are adults. Mr. Justice agreed, and noted that he is working with a group from the Transylvania Regional Hospital to tackle this issue county-wide.
- Mr. Justice commended the School Health Advisory Council for their leadership throughout the year. He reported that the SHAC helped update the bloodborne pathogens policy, implemented the FitnessGram program, and supported school nurses and the Health Department in providing student vision screenings, "tooth bus" dental screenings, and free FluMist vaccinations. Mr. Justice added that he could not say enough good things about the outstanding work of our school nurses.
- School administrators are continuing to work on strategies to prevent bullying. Mr. Justice reported that our principals and assistant principals do a tremendous job in dealing with student discipline every day. He feels that students and staff are very safe in our schools.

The Board commended Mr. Justice for his leadership.

8. LEA Data Profile of Students with Disabilities

Dr. McDaris reported that the Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act (IDEA) requires the Department of Public Instruction to monitor LEAs on a regular basis to ensure compliance with state and federal laws and regulations that govern the provision of special education services to appropriately identified children. The Board reviewed a summary of the most recent LEA Data Profile for Transylvania County Schools. The report showed good results. Dr. McDaris noted that the numbers generated by DPI do not always match the TCS numbers due to differences in data gathering methods. He commended the hard work and dedication of the TCS special education teachers and staff.

9. FY13 Interim Budget Resolution

Dr. McDaris presented the annual interim budget resolution, which would allow the school system to pay salaries and normal operating expenses after June 30 until the adoption of the final budget resolution for the new fiscal year beginning on July 1. ON A MOTION BY MRS. FOX, SECONDED BY MRS. NORMAN, the interim budget resolution for the 2012-2013 year was unanimously approved (see attached).

10. FY13 Budget Update

Dr. McDaris gave an update on the proposed budgets from the Senate and House. The two groups are negotiating, and the final outcome should be decided soon. Dr. McDaris noted that the House proposal is more favorable to public schools.

13. <u>Other Items</u>

Mrs. Norman asked about the status of Adequate Yearly Progress reporting. Dr. McDaris reported that the state will be doing away with AYP and replacing it with a different system that will better complement ABCs reporting. It is not known when the new system will be ready.

Dr. McDaris gave an update on the status of the North Carolina Virtual Academy. It appears that the virtual charter school has revised its projected enrollment number downward since learning that it would receive no support from the Department of Public Instruction or be included under NCSBA liability insurance.

Dr. McDaris reported that all of the proposed school calendar provisions have been removed from the state budget drafts for now. Further discussion on this issue is expected. The Senate is considering giving each LEA a proportionate lump sum of its discretionary funding that could be used for merit pay, across the board pay raises, teacher salaries, etc. School officials say this could create bidding wars for applicants depending on how each school district chooses to apply the money.

There was no further business, and ON A MOTION BY MRS. NORMAN, SECONDED BY MRS. FOX, the meeting was adjourned at 7:09 p.m.
