Dr. McDaris reported that on July 30, 2015, the Burlingame Country Club in Sapphire hosted a fundraising event with proceeds to benefit T. C. Henderson Elementary School. As a result of the support from Burlingame members, area businesses, and residents, Burlingame was able to make a \$10,000 donation to T. C. Henderson Elementary School. Ms. Linda Crowther from Burlingame presented a check to Principal Tony Meachum.

Dr. McDaris welcomed SRO Owen, Attorney Donnahoo, and Jon Miller, recipient of a 2015 Terrell Scruggs Scholarship.

6. Policy

ON A MOTION BY MR. KIVINIEMI, SECONDED BY MRS. SCRUGGS, the Board adopted a resolution outlining the revision of the Board of Education policy manual using the Policies to Lead the Schools "PLS" system published by the North Carolina School Boards Association (see attached).

ON A MOTION BY MRS. SCRUGGS, SECONDED BY MR. KIVINIEMI, the Board unanimously adopted policy 4110, "Immunization and Health Requirements for School Admission," and rescinded policy JHCB, "Immunization and Health Requirements for School Admission."

Jeremy Gibbs presented 14 new policies from the 1000 Series, "Governing Principles," as first-read information and recommended 8 old policies for rescission. Chairman McCoy recommended that policy 1310 be revised to reflect the district's current practice regarding "opt out" options for reproductive health curriculum. ON A MOTION BY MR.

GRIFFIN, SECONDED BY MRS. PETIT, the Board accepted the 14 new policies and 8 old policies listed below as first-read information. Action on the policies will be requested at the next regular meeting.

7. TCCLT

Dr. McDaris reported that at the June 2 meeting, Carroll Parker, Chairman of the Transylvania County Community Land Trust (TCCLT), gave an update on the Gillespie Circle project and requested direction from the Board regarding the future of the project. Attorney Donnahoo discussed the Board's options regarding ownership of the property. He stated that the Board may not give away property; property must be either sold or some sort of consideration given for property the Board no longer wants to keep. Second, the Board may not place a security interest on its property. The Board may not pledge property as collateral to a bank or subject property to a deed of trust.

Dr. McDaris reported that the challenge facing the TCCLT is to find a way to fund infrastructure improvements on the property. Estimated costs for improvements would be \$400,000 to \$450,000. The TCCLT would like to be able to solicit donations, gifts and/or grants to pay for infrastructure improvements; however, they are not the property owners. The Board as owners cannot afford to put money into infrastructure. The State Employees Credit Union has indicated that it would be willing to help fund the project, but they would require collateral. Mrs. Petit asked about partnering with another organization. Mr. Donnahoo reported that title would have to be given over to the partnering organization, and predicted that a bank would be leery of a reverter deed. Mr.

Kiviniemi asked about a joint effort with the City of Brevard. Dr. McDaris reported that changes to state laws regarding annexation would limit what the city could do. Mrs. Scruggs asked about the feasibility of raising funds from private sources to pay for infrastructure a little at a time. Chairman McCoy stated that potential donors would want to have assurance that the project would go forward. Mr. Donnahoo advised that the Board not get into the development business, and stated that it would be unlikely that enough money could be raised for infrastructure through donations and pledges.

Mr. Kiviniemi asked what, if anything, the Board can do to move the project forward. Mr. Donnahoo reported that in similar situations in other counties, the county itself is the owner of the property and can obtain funding from a bank. He advised that if the Board wants to consider this route, they should first research what was done in Buncombe County and then talk with the county commissioners and county manager. Dr. McDaris recommended that the Board not sell the property due to its value and location. The Board was in agreement that it does not want to give up ownership of the land. There was consensus to direct the superintendent to inform Mr. Parker that the TCCLT would need to go in a different direction due to the constraints the Board is under. Chairman McCoy expressed thanks and appreciation to Mr. Parker for his tireless work on the Community Land Trust project. She emphasized that the Board has not abandoned the concept of providing affordable housing for teachers; however, the project faces hurdles that the Board is unable to address at this time.

8. FY15 Budget Amendments

Norris Barger presented the following budget amendments to reflect actual expenditures, mid-year allotments, carryover, and typical year-end activity for the 2014-2015 fiscal year:

ON A MOTION BY MR. KIVINIEMI, SECONDED BY MRS. SCRUGGS, the budget amendments for 2014-2015 (see attached) were unanimously approved.

9. FY16 Budget Update

Dr. McDaris reported that legislators are no closer to approving a state budget at this time. He stated that the House and Senate remain far apart on several major items.

10. NCSBA Board of Director Vacancies

Dr. McDaris reported that the North Carolina School Boards Association (NCSBA) is seeking nominations for possible vacancies on the NCSBA Board of Directors. The term of service is two years, and members are eligible to serve for two terms. The board meets in November at the state conference in Greensboro, and in March, June, and September in Raleigh. In addition, each board member typically serves on two committees, which ordinarily meet once or twice a year. Other meetings are scheduled as needed. Nominations must be made by official board action and sent to the NCSBA offices by September 25. Mr. Kiviniemi stated that he would be interested in serving on the board. ON A MOTION BY MRS. SCRUGGS, SECONDED BY MR. GRIFFIN, the Board unanimously nominated Ron Kiviniemi as a candidate for the NCSBA Board of Directors.

11. NCSBA District Fall Meeting

Dr. McDaris reported that the Transylvania County Board of Education will host the North Carolina School Boards Association District 8 Fall Meeting on Thursday, October 1, 2015. The meeting will be held at Brevard Middle School from 4-9 p.m. At each district meeting, the host county provides a clinic session highlighting a successful/best practice occurring in the district. The hosting board also provides dinner for the attendees and has the option of arranging for entertainment and/or refreshments at check-in. Board members discussed potential topics for the clinic session, agreed to provide student entertainment and light refreshments, and have JROTC cadets present colors at the opening general session.

12. Naming Facilities

Dr. McDaris reported that some time ago, the Rosman Board of Aldermen submitted a request to the Board of Education to name the RHS football field in honor of William J. Cathey, Jr., the first RHS football coach. He noted that that the original request, to rename the Silversteen Stadium, was later revised to specify just the field. He reported that the Board regularly receives requests to name school facilities or portions of facilities in honor of specific individuals and has discussed this matter several times in the past. During the most recent discussion, the Board agreed by consensus to not begin naming facilities or parts of facilities and instead to refer requests of this type to a school recognition committee, such as the RHS Alumni Hall of Fame. Dr. McDaris reported that the Board has reviewed other districts' policies on naming facilities, but to date has not pursued a local policy.

During discussion, Vice Chairman Petit reported that as a board member and RHS alumnus, she receives many requests to name facilities. She stated that the Silversteen family contributed a great deal to Transylvania County and their name is an integral part of the county's heritage. She added that she would not be in favor of renaming facilities and feels that the RHS Alumni Hall of Fame is an appropriate option for recognitions. Chairman McCoy asked whether BHS has a similar recognition committee. Dr. McDaris stated that he is not aware of any such committee at Brevard High School.

Mrs. Scruggs stated that she favors a portion of the Wake County Public Schools policy on naming facilities, which specifies naming in accordance with geographic location or site specific identifiers, such as roads, streets, natural or historical features. She stated that because Transylvania is a small community with many outstanding educators and contributors, she would not want the Board to create potential controversy by recognizing some individuals and not others. Dr. McDaris noted that the school system has not had a consistent naming system historically, as some schools have been named for individuals (i.e., T. C. Henderson, Straus), and others have been named for towns, cities and geographic locations (i.e., Brevard, Rosman, and Pisgah Forest). The Board agreed by consensus to not adopt a policy for naming facilities at this time. Chairman McCoy stated that she would respond to the latest community inquiry.

13. Superintendent's Update

Dr. McDaris reported the following items:

- Teachers will report on Wednesday, August 19 for the first teacher workday.
 Students will arrive on Monday, August 24 for the first day of school.
- Dr. McDaris requested direction from the Board regarding proposed educational options for the schools. Chairman McCoy reported that the Board would like to see a draft timeline at the September meeting for implementing a possible magnet, STEM

or STEAM program at T. C. Henderson Elementary School for the 2016-2017 school year.

Attorney Donnahoo reported that the NCSBA Fall Law Conference will be held on October 14-16 in Asheville.

15. Public Comment

There was no public comment.

16. Other Items

Chairman McCoy reported that she and Mr. Kiviniemi recently had lunch with some county commissioners to discuss funding and ongoing capital needs. The group discussed drafting joint letters to Senator Tom Apodaca, Congressman Mark Meadows and other legislators expressing concerns about state funding shortfalls and the inequities in funding formulas that prevent Transylvania County Schools from sharing in the small system and low wealth supplements that other school systems receive. Increasingly, local government is being asked to make up the difference in state reductions, particularly in teacher assistants, textbooks and drivers' education. Mrs. Scruggs remarked that a joint letter would show cohesiveness between the boards on this issue and reflect that it is not just a political issue but a community issue.

The Board also directed the superintendent to draft a separate letter to legislators regarding concerns about teacher salaries. Mr. Griffin expressed frustration with the way in which the state treats veteran teachers by singling out special groups for pay raises. Mrs. Scruggs stated that North Carolina legislators have succeeded in making teaching the only profession in which the members with the most experience and expertise are not rewarded and in fact receive the least. She stated that the legislature is sending a message that it wants to drive experienced teachers out of the classroom. Mr. Kiviniemi added that it is a sad situation when North Carolina loses experienced teachers to other states like Georgia because they can earn 45% more salary there.

Mr. Kiviniemi stated that at the last meeting he used a poor choice of words, "dereliction of duty," to express his frustration with the county's level of capital outlay funding for the schools. He reviewed the disparity between capital outlay funding requests and actual funding received over the last ten years and remarked that the county's fund balance has continued to grow each year. Mr. Kiviniemi stated that the Board of Education is statutorily required to maintain safe, clean schools. He added that historically, this goal has best been accomplished when a relationship exists in which the Board of Commissioners recognizes the Board of Education as a peer group. Mr. Kiviniemi expressed appreciation to Chairman Hawkins for meeting with him and Chairman McCoy

and expressed hope that the boards can continue to build a mutually respectful peer relationship.

Chairman McCoy reported that the Board voted unanimously at its last meeting to extend the superintendent's contract for another four years and stated that the Board is pleased and excited to continue working with Dr. McDaris.

There was no further business, and ON A MOTION BY MR. GRIFFIN, SECONDED BY MR. KIVINIEMI, the meeting was adjourned at 8:15 p.m.

RESOLUTION FOR POLICY MANUAL CONVERSION

WHEREAS, the Transylvania County Board of Education ("the Board") will begin the process of revising the Transylvania County Board of Education Policy Manual using the Policies to Lead the Schools ("PLS") system published by the North Carolina School Boards Association ("NCSBA"), effective July 20, 2015; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that the revision process will take one to two years to complete; and

WHEREAS, some of the policies in the PLS manual cross-reference policies located in other sections of the PLS manual; and

WHEREAS, at times a policy may reference a policy that has not yet been adopted by the Board;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that such references shall have no binding effect on the Board until the Board actually adopts the referenced policy; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that existing Transylvania County Board of Education policies remain in effect until such time as each policy is superseded by the new PLS-based policy on the same topic or is repealed by the Transylvania County Board of Education; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in order to help school personnel and community members locate specific school board policies while the Board is in the process of adopting polices based on the PLS system, NCSBA will provide Transylvania County Schools with a preliminary correlation table for the entire PLS manual, so that all interested parties may identify which policies in the current policy manual correspond with the policies that are being cross-referenced in newly adopted Transylvania County Board of Education policies; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any school employee, student, parent or guardian, or other member of the community attempting to access a particular board policy should first review the Board's new policy manual for an applicable policy. If there is no newly adopted version of an applicable policy ("new policy") in the Board's new policy manual, the previously adopted policy ("old policy") shall apply; however, if there is or appears to be a discrepancy between any new policy and the old policy, the new policy shall apply and supersede the old policy.
