Dr. David Sutton introduced Sarah Reid, RMS, as the Rookie of the Year for the 2011-2012 school year. The Board presented Mrs. Reid with a plaque and a \$200 check.

Dr. Scott Elliott named Ginger Long, BMS, as Counselor of the Year for 2012-2013. He reported that Mrs. Long was unable to be at the meeting and would be presented with a plaque and a \$500 check at the October board meeting.

Donys Merrill introduced Sarah Justice, RHS, as Media Specialist of the Year for 2012-2013. The Board presented Mrs. Justice with a plaque and \$500 check.

Dr. Jeff McDaris named Jeremy Gibbs, BHS, as Principal of the Year for 2012-2013. The Board presented Mr. Gibbs with a plaque and a \$500 check.

Dr. McDaris reported that earlier this month, the school-level Teacher Assistants of the Year and school-level Teachers of the Year were interviewed by a committee that was charged with selecting one teacher and one teacher assistant as the overall district winners. #### 4. <u>Transylvania County Schools Educational Foundation</u>

Each year the Transylvania County Schools Educational Foundation (TCSEF) awards approximately \$10,000 in mini-grants to TCS teachers for projects that are designed to enrich educational opportunities for students. Foundation Vice President, Peter Johnson, and Grants Committee Chair, Dawn Davenport, gave an update on the Foundation's fund-raising activities and mini-grants for the 2012-2013 year. The Board recessed for a short reception in honor of the educators that were recognized earlier in the evening. Dr. McDaris thanked the TCS Child Nutrition staff for providing the buffet. Following the reception, the business meeting resumed as scheduled.

## 5. <u>Good News Report</u>

Dr. McDaris reported the following good news items:

#### SUMMER FEEDING

The TCS Child Nutrition Department's Summer Feeding program concluded on August 3, 2012. Over 21,000 meals were served during the course of the 62-day program. This averages to 364 meals per day and includes breakfast and lunch. Children were served at six public sites throughout the county and at several closed enrollment programs such as the Boys & Girls Club and Rise and Shine.

#### GOLDEN LEAF GRANT

On September 10, Donys Merrill received official notification that Transylvania County Schools had been awarded the Golden LEAF Open Grant for which she had applied earlier this spring. The grant will enable our school district to move forward in its goal of providing 1:1 computers in the middle schools.

### RES 3<sup>RD</sup> GRADE COMMUNITY PROJECT

During the week of September 4-7, third grade students at Rosman Elementary School completed a literature study on "Officer Buckle and Gloria," a story about a police officer and his dog. As the third grade *Essential Standards* curriculum covers helping in the community, this was a perfect opportunity for Transylvania Deputy Chase Owen and his dog, Ferex, to visit the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade group. Students enjoyed learning about the ways in which Ferex helps law enforcement officers in our community.

#### 6. Former Students in the Military

The Board reviewed the list of former students from Brevard High School, Rosman High School, and Davidson River School who are currently serving or have previously served in the U.S. Military. There were no new names on the list.

## 7. Consent Agenda

ON A MOTION BY MRS. NORMAN, SECONDED BY MRS. MCCOY, the minutes from the August 20, 2012 meeting and the personnel report for September 17, 2012 (attached) were unanimously approved.

## 8. FY13 Budget Resolution

Norris Barger presented the final budget resolution for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2013 (see attached). He reported that the final budget represents a 4.1% decrease in total funding from last year. ON A MOTION BY MRS. MCCOY, SECONDED BY MRS. FOX, the budget resolution for the 2012-2013 school year was unanimously approved.

## 9. Policy

Revised Policy IKF, "Graduation Requirements," was presented as first-read information at the August 20 meeting. Dr. David Sutton reported there had been no new changes to the policy since that time. There were no questions from the Board, and ON A MOTION BY MRS. FOX, SECONDED BY MRS. NORMAN, Policy IKF was approved as presented.

# 10. <u>Superintendent's Goals for 2012-2013</u>

Dr. McDaris presented the superintendent's goals for the 2012-2013 school year. Board members were supportive of the goals. Chairman Whitmire commented on the importance of a strong school system to a county's economic development, especially in terms of recruiting professionals who want to live and raise families here.
