

1 The Transylvania County Board of Education (the “board”) welcomes new and innovative ideas  
2 in curriculum as additional avenues to achieve the goals and objectives of the educational  
3 program. Administrators are encouraged to pursue innovative programs and to take advantage of  
4 community resources in order to enhance and enrich the learning process. In addition, the board  
5 believes that parental involvement is vital to the development and implementation of new  
6 programs and encourages administrators to involve parents in plans for innovative projects.  
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8 The board encourages school administrators to use community resources, including businesses  
9 that can effectively contribute to the advancement of educational goals. Resource persons in the  
10 community may be used in the classroom to help with teaching the prescribed curriculum. High  
11 school administrators are encouraged to partner with local businesses to facilitate high school-to-  
12 work partnerships for students. The board encourages local businesses to work with high school  
13 administrators to create opportunities for students to complete job shadows, internships, or  
14 apprenticeships. The career and technical education administrator shall designate a career  
15 development coordinator at each high school to be the contact person for local businesses.  
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17 The superintendent shall periodically consult with local industries, employers, **business advisory**  
18 **councils**, and the local workforce development board to identify industry certification and  
19 credentials the board may offer to best meet workforce needs. The superintendent shall consider  
20 this information in planning the educational program.  
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22 Other innovative pilot programs may be initiated by the administrators of any school with the  
23 approval of the board. Such programs should be included in the proposed school improvement  
24 plan. If the program will modify the curriculum, the proposal should first be submitted to the  
25 curriculum committee in accordance with policy 3100, Curriculum Development. If a school  
26 improvement plan is already in effect, school administrators may submit a modified plan for  
27 board approval. Board approval is required before implementation may take place.  
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29 All pilot projects and educational programs must comply with state and federal laws and  
30 regulations. Parents and guardians of children in applicable federally funded programs have the  
31 right to inspect all instructional materials used in connection with such programs.  
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33 The superintendent shall develop administrative regulations, as necessary, to implement this  
34 policy.
