

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AND STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS

Policy Code: 3620

1 The Transylvania County Board of Education (the “board”) recognizes the value of
2 interscholastic athletics and extracurricular activities in promoting leadership and team skills,
3 practicing democratic principles, and encouraging the lifelong learning process. Students are
4 encouraged to participate in opportunities available at the school, including interscholastic
5 athletics and student organizations. All activities are open to all students attending that school
6 unless a restriction is justified and has been approved by the principal. The principal shall ensure
7 that students and parents are notified of the various opportunities for participation in
8 extracurricular activities. The principal shall establish any rules necessary for school- and
9 student-initiated extracurricular activities.

10 11 **A. EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITY REQUIREMENTS**

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13 Participation in extracurricular activities, including student organizations and
14 interscholastic athletics, is a privilege, not a right, and may be reserved for students in
15 good academic standing who meet behavior standards established by the board and the
16 school. Participation in extracurricular activities may be restricted if a student (1) is not
17 performing at grade level as provided in policy 3400, Evaluation of Student Progress; (2)
18 has exceeded the number of absences allowed by policy 4400, Attendance; (3) has
19 violated the student conduct standards found in the 4300 series of policies; or (4) has
20 violated school rules for conduct. In addition, in order to be eligible for interscholastic
21 athletics participation, students must have been in daily attendance eighty-five percent
22 (85%) of the previous semester and must meet all applicable eligibility standards of the
23 North Carolina High School Athletic Association, the North Carolina Department of
24 Public Instruction, and any locally established requirements for interscholastic athletics
25 participation. **Students in the sixth grade are eligible to participate in all interscholastic
26 athletics except football.**

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28 School administrators choosing to exercise the authority to restrict participation based
29 upon any of the reasons provided in the previous paragraph shall provide this policy and
30 any additional rules developed by the superintendent or the principal to all parents or
31 guardians and students. The grievance procedure provided in policy 1740/4010, Student
32 and Parent Grievance Procedure, may be utilized by parents or students who believe that
33 a student has been aggrieved by a decision made pursuant to this policy.

34 35 **B. SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES**

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37 ~~1. Extracurricular activities may be used as a component of an at-risk student’s
38 intervention plan. The intervention plan may include providing for or restricting
39 the student’s participation in extracurricular activities. If the plan restricts the
40 student’s participation, the plan must include other intervention strategies
41 designed to improve student performance.~~

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43 1. Students with disabilities must be accorded the legal rights required by federal

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- 44 and state law.
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46 2. School administrators shall facilitate the inclusion and participation of
47 transitioning military children in extracurricular activities, to the extent they are
48 otherwise qualified, by:
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50 a. providing information about extracurricular activities to transitioning
51 military children; and
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53 b. waiving application deadlines.
