The principal or designee shall maintain on file immunization and health assessment records for all students, and these records may be inspected by officials of the county or state health departments in accordance with state and federal law. Each school principal shall file required reports with the Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of Public Instruction.

94		parent must submit to the school. If a member of the school staff has reason to believe

113		Notwithstanding the provisions of this policy, admissions for homeless students will not
115		be prohibited or delayed due to the student's inability to provide documentation of
116		immunizations or health assessments. The homeless liaison shall work with the student,
117		parent/guardian, school personnel or other agencies to obtain documentation of
118		immunization and/or the health assessment or to arrange for such immunizations and/or
119		assessments in a timely manner.
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120	D.	CHILDREN OF MILITARY FAMILIES
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122		The board acknowledges that immunization requirements for newly enrolling military
123		children are governed by the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military
125		Children. Children of military families, as defined in policy 4050, Children of Military
126		Families, will have 30 days from the date of enrollment or within such time as reasonably
127		determined by the rules of the Interstate Commission to obtain any required
127		immunization. For a series of immunizations, initial vaccinations must be obtained
