

1 The Transylvania County Board of Education (the “board”) believes that the dress and personal  
2 appearance of students greatly affect their academic performance and their interaction with other  
3 students. The board requests that parents outfit their children in clothing that is conducive to  
4 learning. Generally, dress and grooming standards as determined by the student and his or her  
5 parents will be deemed acceptable. However, the board prohibits any appearance or clothing that  
6 does the following:

- 8 1. violates a reasonable dress code adopted and publicized by the school;

- 10 2. is substantially disruptive (for information on gang-related attire, see policy 4328, Gang-  
11 Related Activity);
- 12
- 13 3. is provocative or obscene; or
- 14
- 15 4. endangers the health or safety of the student or others.
- 16

17 Before receiving disciplinary consequences, a student who is not in compliance with this policy  
18 or a school dress code will be given a reasonable period of time to make adjustments so that he  
19 or she will be in compliance. Disciplinary consequences for a student who fails to comply after  
20 being offered this opportunity will be consistent with Section D of policy 4300, Student  
21 Behavior Policies. The superintendent or designee shall list in the Code of Student Conduct the  
22 specific range of consequences that may be imposed on a student for violation of the dress code.
