## 115 D. PARENT INVOLVEMENT OTHER RELEVANT POLICIES

117 In addition to this policy, the board, with parental and community input, has developed 118 other policies concerning surveys and related matters as required by the Protection of 119 Pupil Rights Amendment. These policies include: 1310/4002, Parental Involvement; 120 3210, Parental Inspection of and Objection to Instructional Materials; 4700, Student 121 Records; and 5240, Advertising in the Schools. The Transylvania County Board of 122 Education (the "board") and superintendent will work with parents to create policies and 123 guidelines concerning: (1) the administration of surveys by third parties; (2) 124 arrangements to protect student privacy in the administration of surveys containing a 125 protected topic; (3) parental rights to review and inspect instructional materials or survey 126 instruments; and (4) the collection, disclosure, or use of personal information for 127 marketing or selling purposes. 128
