## Vocational Education Services, Products and Properties

Vocational products and services are considered exempt from G.S. 115C-518 and 160A (Article 12); however, they are covered by 115C, Article 10, part 2.

Such products and services shall be disposed of in the following manner:

- 1. Surplus livestock may be sold locally for no less than the current market value. The Vocational Director shall advertise the surplus livestock through the local media establishing a minimum bid price reflecting current market value. If no bids are received, the surplus livestock shall be sold at a livestock market open to the public. In both situations, the surplus livestock will be sold to the highest bidder.
- 2. Horticultural and agricultural products (other than livestock) produced for sale shall be advertised in the local media.
  - Advertisements shall state what is to be sold, where the sale is to take place and the price(s) of the items(s) to be sold.
- 3. Services, such as those provided in work experience projects, for private individuals as a part of vocational training, shall be publicly announced before beginning the project.
  - If the demand for such services exceeds the need, the instructor shall select those most appropriate for instruction.
  - The primary purpose of work experiences which result in products for sale shall be the instruction of the student and not competition with private enterprise.
  - Written agreements or contracts that stipulate the scope of the work and costs involved shall be signed prior to commencement of the work.
- 4. Live project houses shall be disposed of according to G.S. 160A 266.
- 5. Written receipts must be given for all funds received and deposited according to G.S. 115C-162.
