The North Carolina General Assembly passed a law effective August 1, 1998 which requires students to be in school and making satisfactory progress towards graduation in order to get a driving permit/driver's license or to keep a driver's license.

All schools are required to notify the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) when a student drops out of school or is no longer making adequate academic progress toward graduation. If the student holds a driving permit and/or driver's license, the permit or license will be suspended until the student reaches eighteen years of age or returns to school and/or begins making satisfactory progress towards graduation.

Our records indicate that your son/daughter _____ is in violation of this law for the following reason(s):

- _____ Dropping out of school
- _____ Not making adequate academic progress (passing at least 70% of classes the prior semester)

This letter is to inform you that _____ will be reported to the Department of Motor Vehicles and may lose his/her driving permit/license based on this legislation. I will report this information to the DMV on _____.

Hardship appeals and all supporting documentation must be submitted to me prior to the date outlined in the above paragraph. For your information, I am including with this letter a copy of School Board Policy IGAJ, which outlines the appeal procedure.
