1 The Board strives to create a safe, orderly, caring, and inviting school environment. Gangs and gang-related activities have proven contrary to that mission and are prohibited within the 2 schools. A gang is any ongoing organization, association, or group of three or more persons, 3 4 whether formal or informal, having as one of its primary activities the commission of criminal 5 acts and having a common name or common identifying sign, colors, or symbols. The violence 6 and crime that accompany gangs pose a serious threat to the safety of students and employees of 7 the school system. Even absent acts of violence or crime, the existence of gang-related activity 8 within the schools creates an atmosphere of fear and hostility that obstructs student learning and 9 achievement. Thus, the Board condemns the existence of gangs and will not tolerate gang-10 related activity in the school system. 11 12 A. **PROHIBITED BEHAVIOR** 13 14 Gang-related activity is strictly prohibited within the schools. For the purposes of this 15 policy, "gang-related activity" means: (1) any conduct that is prohibited by another Board policy and is engaged in by a student on behalf of an identified gang or as a result 16 of the student's gang membership; or, (2) any conduct engaged in by a student to 17 18 perpetuate, proliferate, or display the existence of any identified gang. 19 20 Conduct prohibited by this policy includes: 21 22 Wearing, possessing, using, distributing, displaying, or selling any clothing, 1. jewelry, emblems, badges, symbols, signs, or other items with the intent to 23 24 convey membership or affiliation in a gang; 25 Communicating either verbally or non-verbally (gestures, handshakes, slogans, 26 2. drawings, etc.) with the intent to convey membership or affiliation in a gang; 27 28 29 Tagging, or otherwise defacing school or personal property with symbols or 3. 30 slogans intended to convey membership or affiliation in a gang (see Policy JFC, 31 "Student Conduct/Discipline"); 32 33 Requiring payment of protection, insurance, or otherwise intimidating or 4. threatening any person related to gang activity (see Policy JFC, "Student 34 35 Conduct/Discipline"); 36 37 Inciting others to intimidate or to act with physical violence upon any other 5. person related to gang activity (see Policy JFC, "Student Conduct/Discipline"); 38 39 40 6. Soliciting others for gang membership; and, 41 42 7. Committing any other illegal act or other violation of school system policies in 43 connection with gang-related activity.

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47		The superintendent or designee shall regularly consult with law enforcement officials to
48		maintain current examples of gang-related activities, including but not limited to gang
49 50		names and particularized examples of potential gang indicators including symbols, hand
50		signals, graffiti, clothing, accessories, and behaviors. Each principal shall maintain a list
51 52		of current examples of gang-related activities to assist students, parents, and teachers in
52 53		identifying gang symbols and practices. The list shall be available in an easily accessible location in the main office of the school. Parents, students, and school employees may,
55 54		upon request, access the list, which shall include a warning that wearing or displaying
54 55		clothing, hand signs, or symbols identified in the list with the intent to convey
55 56		membership or affiliation in any gang may subject a student to discipline under this

59		In addition, the Code of Student Conduct and all student handbooks (or such other similar
60		materials distributed to parents and students in lieu of a student handbook) shall contain
61		notice that (1) current information on gang-related activities is maintained in the main
62		office at each school; (2) information on gang-related activities is subject to change and
63		the principal should be consulted for updates; and, (3) wearing or displaying clothing,
64		hand signs or symbols identified in the list with the intent to convey membership or
65		affiliation in any gang may subject a student to discipline under this policy. The Code of
66		Student Conduct and student handbook (or such other similar materials) also shall
67		provide the addresses of websites that contain additional information identifying gang
68		signs, symbols, clothing, and other gang indicators.
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70		In providing this information for students and parents, the Board acknowledges that not
71		all potential gang indicators connote actual membership in a gang.
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73 74	C.	CONSEQUENCES
74 75		Perform being muniched for a violation of subsection $A_1$ or $A_2$ above a student shall
75 76		Before being punished for a violation of subsection A.1 or A.2, above, a student shall receive an individualized warning as to what item or conduct is in violation of this policy
77		and shall be permitted to immediately change or remove any prohibited items. A student
78		may be punished only if he or she previously received notice that the specific item or
79		conduct is prohibited.

81		Disciplinary consequences for violations of subsections A.1, A.2 and A.6, above, shall be
82		consistent with Policy JFC, "Student Conduct/Discipline." The superintendent or
83		designee shall list in the Code of Student Conduct the specific range of consequences that
84		may be imposed on a student for violations of these subsections.
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86 87 88 89 90 91 92	Violations of subsections A.3, A.4, A.5 and A.7, above, are violations of both this policy and other Board policies. Disciplinary consequences for such violations shall be consistent with Policy JFC, "Student Conduct/Discipline," and the specific range of consequences listed in the Code of Student Conduct for the other Board policy violated. That the violation was gang-related shall be an aggravating factor when determining the appropriate consequences.
93	In a situation where a student has violated this policy or is otherwise suspected of gang
94	affiliation through other circumstantial evidence, the principal shall conduct an
95	intervention involving the principal and/or assistant principal, the student and the
96	student's parent. Such intervention also may include the school resource officer and
97	others as appropriate. The purpose of an intervention is to discuss school officials'
98	observations and concerns and to offer the student and his or her parents information and
99	an opportunity to ask questions or provide other information to the school officials.
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101	This policy shall be applied in a non-discriminatory manner based on the objective
102	characteristics of the student's conduct in light of the surrounding circumstances.
