
Regulations, Title I

In accordance with the federal *No Child Left Behind Act of 2001*, to achieve parent involvement the local education agency shall:

1. ~~Involve parents in the joint development of the Transylvania County Schools Title I plan by utilizing Transylvania County Schools Parent Advisory Council members and providing each school's School Improvement Team with opportunities to review the plan.~~
2. ~~Provide coordination, technical assistance, and other support from various central office departments to assist schools with planning and implementing parent involvement activities. These could include such activities as Muffins for Moms/Doughnuts for Dads/Pastries for Parents reading activities all designed to improve student academic achievement and school performance.~~
3. ~~Build capacity for strong parental involvement by:~~
 - a. ~~Helping parents interpret and comprehend all national, state, and local standards and expectations through community meetings, and distributing parent information in all languages represented in Transylvania County schools in easy to understand formats;~~
 - b. ~~Providing materials to parents to help them assist with their child's education;~~
 - e. ~~Working with staff members in Transylvania County schools to ensure their understanding of the value of parental involvement;~~
 - d. ~~Including parents on the Transylvania County Schools district Parent Advisory Council and on individual School Improvement Teams;~~
 - e. ~~Providing opportunities and support for schools to conduct programs in the community;~~
 - f. ~~Coordinating parent involvement efforts with those of state-run preschools where appropriate; and~~
 - g. ~~Providing support based on reasonable parent requests~~
4. ~~Coordinate and integrate all parent involvement strategies implemented by Transylvania County Schools.~~
5. ~~Annually conduct a review of this policy and of parent involvement strategies included in the Title I application with parents.~~
