38			athletic events, musical programs, and dramatic productions.

50			visitors of this requirement.

55		3.	Persons who are subject to policy ACAC, "Registered Sex Offenders," must

60		To mi	To minimize disruption to student learning and school operations, the Board establishes			
61		the following additional requirements for visits by probation officers during the scho				
62		day:

64		1.	Probation officers may not visit students on school property during school hours			
65			unless the visit is conducted through the Division of Community Corrections'			
66			School Partnership Program.			
67						
68		2.	Visits by probation officers must be authorized in advance by the school principal			
69			or designee or be the result of a request for assistance by a guidance counselor or			
70			school resource officer. The principal or designee at each school shall coordinate			
71			with probation officers to plan and schedule visits to occur at times least			
72			disruptive to the student's academic schedule and to school operations.			
73						
74		3.	To protect the privacy of students, the principal or designee shall designate a			
75			private area for probation officers to meet with students away from contact with			
76			the general student population. Initial contact with the student will be made by a			
77			designated school employee, who shall direct the student to the private area to			
78			meet with the probation officer.

80		4.	Probation officers may not initiate direct contact with any student while the			
81			student is in class or between classes.

83		5.	All visits must be conducted in accordance with this policy and any additional			
84			guidelines developed by the superintendent or designee.

87 88	D.	UNAUTHORIZED, DISRUPTIVE OR DANGEROUS VISITORS		
00 89		If a school employee becomes aware that an individual is on a school property without		
90		having received permission or that an individual is exhibiting unusual, threatening or		
91		dangerous behavior, the employee must either direct the individual to the administrative		
92		office or notify the principal, designee or school resource officer, depending on the		
93		circumstances.		
94				
95		If a school employee suspects that an individual is on school property in violation of		
96		policy ACAC, "Registered Sex Offenders," the employee must immediately notify the		
97		principal, designee or school resource officer.		
98				
99		Students will be instructed to notify a school employee of any unusual or suspicious		
100		behavior by visitors. School employees shall inform the principal or designee		
101		immediately of a student's report of suspicious behavior on the part of a school visitor.		
102				
103		When an individual disrupts the educational environment, acts in a disorderly manner,		
104		damages school property, or violates Board policy or the law, the principal or designee		
105		has authority to:		
106				
107		1. Order the individual to leave school property;		
108				
109		2. Notify law enforcement; or		
110				
111		3. Take any other action deemed appropriate under the circumstances.		
112				
113		Failure to comply with a request to leave school grounds may result in the filing of		
114		trespass charges or other charges as appropriate against the offending individual.		
115				
116		The Superintendent, upon recommendation from the principal, may deny an individual		
117		permission to come onto school grounds or enter a school facility for up to one school		
118		year if the individual is guilty of disruptive or dangerous behavior on school grounds.
