Our solution will include **(207) high-resolution IP cameras (across both schools)**, **(2) 128-Channel Network Video Recorders (NVRs)**, and **built-in secure data storage options** that provide 24/7 monitoring capabilities with real-time alerts and remote access for school administrators. All of the cameras provided in this bid are open-platform and capable of integration with access control systems, depending on the open capabilities of the access control system.

Efficient Installation & Integration

Appendix C.4 - Implementation Plan

SCW will provide both a project management platform, accessible by the Transylvania County Schools team, and a dedicated project management team responsible for ensuring a smooth rollout across the school district.

For each identified site, SCW's project management team is prepared to finalize each system design, coordinate and schedule installation labor with each site, coordinate shipment of all equipment and materials, oversee the progress of the work, and finally, obtain documentation and approval of completed work. SCW will pull the needed county permits required for the installation.

Details of each system's configuration and access would be maintained in our project management platform to streamline future support requests handled by our remote technical support team or on-site service requests coordinated by our Installation Services team.

Additionally, SCW is open and flexible to tailoring its role to the specific needs of each site. In the case of a retrofit, it may make the most sense for SCW to manage the whole of the installation. For new construction, however, it may be more cost-effective for the electrical contractor to pre-wire the system and for SCW to take responsibility for hanging the cameras, installing the NVR, and configuring the system.

There will be a series of structured meetings to help ensure a smooth delivery of the project, Those meetings are as follows;

Project Kick-off Meeting - There will be a project kick-off meeting between the dedicated PM from SCW and the TCS team for each project to ensure the timeline and installation schedules align.



Midway Check-in Meeting - There will be a dedicated meeting approximately halfway through each project to ensure that things are going according to plan and are staying on track.

System Tuning and Training Meeting - There will be a final meeting for each project at the "wrap-up" stage of the project to ensure the systems settings are set correctly and to prepare for the training that will be provided. The outcome of this meeting is to ensure the training is scheduled accordingly.

Appendix C.5 - Support & Service Commitment

Support

SCW's premium support is US-based and **100% free for life.** Our North Carolina-based team is available Monday- Friday, 9 AM-7 PM, to help with any system issue.

The vast majority of support issues can be resolved remotely, however, when an issue cannot be addressed remotely, on-site service is available at a rate of \$350 for the first 2 hours and \$150 per additional hour.

SCW's Technical team in Asheville is available to troubleshoot any system issue, complete initial system setups, adjust configurations, set up remote viewing, perform system maintenance, help with user management and setup, and provide training on any aspect of system operation, maintenance, or configuration. SCW support is available via phone, email, or chat and can remotely login to a computer on site to make completing troubleshooting or support tasks even easier.

Service Commitment

All SCW equipment comes standard with a 3-year warranty. An optional 5 year warranty upgrade is available for an additional cost.

There is no cost for the replacement of equipment under warranty.

SCW offers a flat 20% discount for device replacement if the failure is not under warranty. SCW's warranty covers any failure or defect that is not the result of physical damage to the equipment, such damage resulting from tampering, vandalism, lightning strikes, power surges, extreme weather, or "acts of God".

If the installation was completed by SCW, equipment is additionally covered under SCW's one-year (four-season) installation warranty for any failure that results from improper installation. If the installation is completed by a 3rd party, failures resulting from improper installation would not be covered under SCW's warranty.

In the event of a broken device, Meritage contacts SCW's technical support team by phone, email, or chat. If, after basic troubleshooting, it is determined that the device needs to be replaced, SCW's team will minimize system downtime by immediately shipping replacement equipment along with a return label for the defective equipment.



If needed, SCW's team can additionally schedule on-site service for any labor required to effect equipment replacement at on-site service rates of \$350 for the first 2 hours and \$150 for each additional hour.

If work is covered under SCW's Installation Warranty (i.e., the system or device issue results from the labor performed by SCW), SCW is responsible for 100% of the cost of any required on-site service.

If it's deemed that the work completed is not covered by SCW's Installation Warranty, the end user is responsible for the costs associated with on-site work.

This Agreement is between Security Camera Warehouse, Inc. a Delaware Corporation, hereinafter referred to as "Installer," and Transylvania County Schools of 609 North Country Club Road

Brevard, NC 28712, the legal tenant and/or owner, hereinafter referred to as "Owner."

In consideration of the promises herein, it is mutually agreed as follows:

- 1. The Contract shall be made up of the Installation Agreement, all plans, drawings, schedules and specifications attached to and referenced in this Installation Agreement.
- 2. Installer agrees to perform and complete, and furnish the necessary labor and materials, including tools, required to perform and complete all the items listed and detailed in SECTION D: SCOPE OF WORK and PAYMENT and hereafter referred to as the "Work." All work to be completed in a workmanlike manner according to standard practices and subject to all stipulations and conditions specified in SECTIONS A-D of this Agreement.
- 3. Installer and Owner agree to a flat fee as specified in SECTION D: SCOPE OF WORK and PAYMENT. Owner agrees to pay or cause to be paid to Installer in consideration for his performance of the Work, payment as specified in SECTION D: SCOPE OF WORK and PAYMENT.

SECTION A: INSTALLER RESPONSIBILITY

1. GENERAL DUTIES AND INSTALLATION PROCEDURE: Installer shall supervise and direct the Work. Installer shall be



solely responsible for and have control over installation means, methods, techniques, sequences and procedures and for coordinating all portions of the Work under this Agreement. Owner may not retain subinstallers, material-men or suppliers directly to perform any portion of the Work.

- 2. SUBINSTALLERS: Installer may use Subinstallers to perform some of the Work. Installer shall ensure that all subinstallers have the proper training and job oversight. Installer shall ensure that the quality of the Work performed by subinstallers is consistent with the best practices in the industry and the quality of the Work on other Security Camera Warehouse, Inc. projects.
- 3. LICENSES AND INSURANCE: Installer agrees to fully comply with all local, state and federal licensing requirements. SCW is duly licensed by the North Carolina Alarm System Licensing Board (3101 Industrial Drive, Suite 104, Raleigh, NC 27609, 919-788-532). Installer agrees to carry Installer's Liability Insurance in the sum of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000). Installer also agrees to carry Workers Compensation Insurance coverage on all employees and subinstallers performing work on the project. A copy of the Certificate of Insurance will be provided to Owner upon request.
- 4. PERMITS AND CODES: Installer and subinstallers will obtain all permits necessary for completion of the Work and will comply with all permitting requirements. All Work to be done as a part of this Agreement will be in compliance with the building codes presently in force in the municipality where the project is located.
- 5. SUBSTANDARD FRAMING AND UTILITIES: Except as specifically noted otherwise in the Scope of Work, the Scope of work anticipates that all framing, wiring, plumbing and other utilities that are not visible before the start of the Work are of standard quality and not deficient. In the event that there is any substandard or deficient framing, wiring, plumbing, or other utilities that must be replaced, repaired or reworked in order to complete the Work, the additional cost of its repair or replacement will be paid for by Owner, as an additional charge above the price in this Agreement.
- 6. EXISTING OUT OF PLUMB AND OUT OF LEVEL CONDITIONS: Except as specifically noted in the Scope of Work, Installer is not responsible for correcting existing out of plumb or out of level conditions in the existing structure.
- 7. TERMITES AND ROT: Except as specifically noted in the Scope of Work, Installer is not responsible for correcting damage caused by termites or rot.
- 8. MATCHING EXISTING FINISHES: Owner acknowledges that exact duplication of existing textures, colors, finishes and planes to blend with the existing structure may not be possible in every instance. Installer will have met his obligation with respect to such duplication if Installer makes every reasonable effort to match existing textures, colors, finishes and planes, consistent with standard industry practice and promptly notifies Owner when such matches cannot reasonably be achieved.
- 9. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS: Except as specifically noted in the Scope of Work, Installer will not be liable for testing, removal, or disposal costs due to asbestos, lead, chlorofluorocarbons, or any other hazardous materials(as defined by the Environmental Protection Agency) contained in existing building materials. Owner shall be responsible for such testing, removal, encapsulation and disposal and the costs shall be paid for by the Owner as an additional charge above



the price in this Agreement.

- 10. RADON: Except as specifically noted in the Scope of Work, Installer will not be liable for testing or mitigation costs due to the presence of radon gas.
- 11. CONCEALED CONDITIONS: Installer agrees to promptly notify Owner about any concealed conditions which will require changes in the Scope of Work.
- 12. CLEANLINESS AND DEBRIS: Installer will take care to store tools, materials and debris in an organized manner as convenient as possible for Owner without sacrificing work efficiency. Trash and debris will be stored on site in a designated area and removed on a timely basis throughout the project and final removal of all debris shall be upon completion of the Work. The work site shall be kept broom clean. No cleaning service is provided.
- 13. JESSICA LUNSFORD ACT: Under North Carolina law, certain sex offenders are prohibited from coming onto school campuses. Installer agrees to conduct an annual check of the N.C. Sex Offender and Public Protection Registration Program, the N.C. Sexually Violent Predator Registration Program and the National Sex Offender Registry for all of its employees whose job involves entering campus while students are present as part of the job. The Owner prohibits any personnel listed on such registries from being on any property owned or operated by the Owner and from having any direct interaction with students. As a term of the Agreement, said checks must be performed by the Installer and reported to the Owner's Superintendent or designee, if Installer's employees will be entering campus while students are present. Under provisions set forth in the Jessica Lunsford Act under North Carolina law, the signature below certifies that neither Installer nor any employee or agent of Installer is listed as a sex offender on the N.C. Sex Offender and Public Protection Registration Program, the N.C. Sexually Violent Predator Registration Program, and/or the National Sex Offender Registry.
- 14. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW AND BOARD POLICY: Installer agrees to comply with all federal and State laws, rules, regulations, administrative requirements, and the following Board of Education Policies and Procedures applicable to its provision of the services described hereunder during the term of the Agreement, if any: Board Policies 5025 *Prohibition of Drugs and Alcohol;* 5026/7250 *Smoking and Tobacco Products;* 5027/7275 *Weapons and Explosives Prohibited.* Installer declares that it has complied with all federal, state, and local laws and regulations regarding business permits, certificates, and licenses that may be required to carry out the work to be performed under the Agreement.

SECTION B: OWNER RESPONSIBILITIES

1. GENERAL DUTIES: Owner(s) warrants and represents that Owner has the legal capacity, including sole ownership of or leasehold interest in the property on which the Work is to be performed, to enter into this Agreement with Installer. Owner will provide a safe and secure work site for Installer. Owner agrees not to modify the property or dwelling during the course of the project in such a manner as to render it a less safe and secure work site for Installer than at the date of this Agreement. Owner will promptly notify Installer of any change that will affect Installer's ability to perform the Work. Owner will also make timely payments to Installer according to the payment terms of this Agreement.



- 2. UTILITIES: All telephone, electricity, gas, water, heat and sewage disposal costs necessary for the construction process will be provided by Owner.
- 3. SITE INSPECTIONS: Owner (or any person appointed by Owner) may make reasonable inspections of the work site, provided that such inspections do not interfere with the work being done, and that they may be done safely. Owner (or any person appointed by Owner) shall be at their own risk while on the work site and shall take proper precautions for their own safety.
- 4. WORKSITE ACCESS: Owner agrees to remove personal belongings from work areas, staging areas, and materials storage areas on a timely basis as the project progresses. Owner agrees to keep children and pets away from work areas, staging areas, material and debris storage areas. Owner accepts all responsibility for the management and well-being of any children, guests or pets left on site during the work day.
- 5. OWNER RELATIONS WITH SUBINSTALLERS AND EMPLOYEES: Owner agrees to address any issue or questions concerning the Work only to Installer. No agreements of any kind shall be made between Owner and any supplier, subinstaller or employees participating in the project, without written approval of Installer.
- 6. OWNER COORDINATION WITH INSTALLER: Owner agrees to furnish Installer with all details and decisions about unspecified construction details that must be made during the course of the Work within 24 hours of Installers request for such information. Owner agrees to promptly agree/decline to any changes in the Scope of the Work that may arise.

SECTION C: GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. CONTRACT DOCUMENTS: Installer and Owner warrant and represent that they have read and are familiar with all of the terms, conditions and obligations in the Contract. The Contract is comprised of this Installation Agreement, all plans, schedules and specifications attached to and referenced in this Installation Agreement. In the event of a conflict between this Installation Agreement, the plans, schedules, and specifications, the terms of this Installation Agreement shall be controlling.
- 2. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: The Contract constitutes the entire agreement between Installer and Owner.
- 3. ITEMS NOT SPECIFICALLY INCLUDED: Items of work not specifically included in the Scope of Work are not part of the Contract. Work may be added to the Scope of Work and will become part of the Contract only upon execution of an additional written Installation Agreement, signed by Owner and Installer.
- 4. PHOTO RELEASE: SCW reserves the right to take photograph and video of work for marketing and training purposes.
- 5. PARKING, WORK HOURS AND SITE ACCESS: Owner agrees to make available to Installer areas for material and debris storage and areas for staging and working until completion of the Work. Owner agrees to make available daily and/or long-term parking for vehicles that may be used as part of the Work. Installer agrees to work only between the hours of 7:00 AM and 6:30 PM, Monday through Saturday, unless permission to work other hours is given by Owner. Owner shall provide access to all locked areas that require access by Installer. Installer shall not make copies of any keys without the written consent of Owner. Keys and any copies shall be returned at completion.



6. DELAYS IN CONSTRUCTION: Installer agrees to pursue work diligently through completion of the Work. Installer agrees to complete Work within the time limits specified in this Agreement, unless that schedule becomes impossible to follow due to a Just Delay. A Just Delay shall mean any delay due to serious illness, accident, fire, war, riot, lightning, earthquake, poor weather, strikes, theft,vandalism, unavailability of materials, unreasonable delays in delivery of materials, unreasonable delays caused by subinstallers or ancillary trade work, delays caused by inspectors, extra work ordered separate Installation Agreement, extra work ordered by Owner, failure of Owner to make decisions or provide information or access, failure of Owner to make payment, discovery of concealed conditions, filled ground or rock, substandard framing and utilities, out of plumb and out of level conditions, termites and rot, hazardous material, radon, government actions, or other causes beyond Installer's control. Owner shall make no demand for liquidated damages for delays or actual damages for Just Delays.

7. PAYMENT SCHEDULE: Owner shall pay Installer promptly in accordance with the terms set forth below in SECTION D: SCOPE OF WORK and PAYMENT AMOUNT. Timely payment is of the essence.

Prior to commencement of work Installer shall invoice Owner for Equipment total listed in SECTION D: SCOPE OF WORK and PAYMENT AMOUNT payable within 30 days, according to the terms outlined in the separately executed Purchase Order Terms agreement. Installer shall invoice owner for the installation services total listed in SECTION D: SCOPE OF WORK and PAYMENT AMOUNT together with payment for any agreed upon Change Orders upon completion of work.

'>This invoice will be payable within 30 days, according to the terms outlined in the separately executed Purchase Order Terms agreement.

Installer agrees to pay all employees, material suppliers, and subinstallers providing services on this project.

- 8. TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT BY OWNER: Owner may terminate this Agreement for any of the following reasons:
- a. Except in the case of a Just Delay, failure of Installer to perform scheduled Work on the project for a period of ten (10) business days unless the absence has been approved in writing by Owner. b. Except in the case of a Just Delay, failure of Installer to remedy Building Department citations or notices within ten (10) business days unless the delay has been approved in writing by Owner. c. Substantial failure of Installer to satisfactorily comply with the conditions of this Contract. Owner must give ten (10) days written notice of intent to terminate this Contract. During that time, if the grounds for termination are remedied by Installer, the Contract will still remain in force. In the event of termination of the Contract by Owner, Owner shall remain liable to pay Installer for reimbursable Contract costs, including overhead and profit, applicable to all labor, materials and supplies Installer has utilized or ordered for the Work prior to the effective date of termination.
- 9. TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT BY THE INSTALLER: If Owner fails to make any payment within five (5) days of its submittal date, or fails to cooperate with Installer to the point where further project progress is impossible or prohibitively expensive, or unreasonably withholds consent for an amendment in the scope of work necessitated by an instruction or order from a regulatory body or an inspector, or withholds consent to an amendment in the scope of



work necessitated by any of the conditions identified in this Contract, Installer may stop work until problem is resolved or terminate the Contract upon ten (10) days written notice to Owner. In the event of such termination, Owner will be fully liable for the reimbursable project costs related to all of the work actually executed as of the effective date of termination, including overhead and profit. In addition, Owner will be liable for the cost of any reasonable losses caused to Installer because of the termination. Installer will have no obligation to perform further work once termination notice is given, until such time as the problem is resolved. If the problem is resolved before the end of the notice period, this Agreement will remain in force, except that any completion dates will be extended by the number of days between termination notice and resolution.

- 10. TERMS OF ENFORCEMENT: The Contract shall be legally binding on Installer and Owner for themselves, their heirs, executors, successors and assignees. The Contract contains the entire agreement between Owner and Installer, supersedes any and all prior Agreements and understandings between the parties, and may not be changed unless mutually agreed upon in writing by both parties. In the event any provision of the Contract is found legally unenforceable, such unenforceability shall not prevent enforcement of any other provision of this Contract. The Contract shall be governed by the Laws of the State of North Carolina.
- 11. WARRANTIES: Installer will provide a warranty for a period of one (1) year on general construction materials and labor, one (1) year on all third party accessories, and three (3) years on all SCW brand equipment. Installer will not provide any warranty unless all materials, labor and construction items purchased or provided by Installer and invoiced are paid for in full by Owner. The warranty period will commence upon substantial completion of the project. If Owner reports defective materials or workmanship within the specified time period, Installer will repair or replace the problem items, or otherwise remedy the defect, at Installer's option. All other warranties, verbal written or implied, are disclaimed including the implied warranties of the habitability, workmanlike construction, merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose, and in no event will Installer be held liable for incidental or consequential damages or losses.
- 12. LEGAL FEES: If a suit, action or arbitration is instituted in connection with any controversy arising out of the Contract, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the non-prevailing party its costs and reasonable attorney's fees.
- 13. WAIVER OF PERFORMANCE: Waiver by any party of strict performance of any provision of the Contract shall not be considered a waiver of the same provision in the future, or of any other provision.
- 14. DISPUTE RESOLUTION: In the event any dispute or difference should arise between the Parties as to their rights, entitlement and liabilities under any portion of this Agreement, then the Parties agree that their disputes and differences shall be resolved, if possible, without court intervention. As such, the Parties hereby agree that mediation shall be the primary method with which to resolve any such disputes or differences, and the Parties hereby agree to submit any such dispute to a mediator. If such dispute or a portion thereof is not resolved through the primary method of mediation, the Parties agree to submit themselves to the jurisdiction of the North Carolina courts and specifically to the venue of the Buncombe County Superior Court.



- 15. LIENS: Installer warrants that title to each portion of the Work will pass to Owner at the time Installer receives payment from Owner for each such portion of Work. Installer further warrants that upon submitting an invoice for payment, all Work covered by the invoice shall, to the best of Installer's knowledge, be free and clear of liens, claims, security interests or encumbrances in favor of Installer, subinstallers, material suppliers, or other persons or entities making a claim by reason of having provided labor, materials, or equipment relating to the Work.
- 16. AUDIT: The Owner or auditors contracted by the Owner may be given access to persons and records that are generated as a result of, or are related to, the Agreement for purposes of verifying accounts and data affecting fees or performance.
- 17. NORTH CAROLINA PUBLIC RECORDS LAW: Installer acknowledges that the Board is subject to the requirements of North Carolina's Public Records Law ("NCPRL"), N.C.G.S. §132-1, *et. seq.* The Agreement and any related documents, papers, letters, maps, books, photographs, films, sound recordings, magnetic or other tapes, electronic data-processing records, artifacts, or other documentary material, regardless of physical form or characteristics, made or received by the Owner in connection with the transaction of the Agreement may be considered a "public record," subject to disclosure under the NCPRL. The Owner is under no obligation to notify the Installer prior to its compliance with its duties under NCPRL.
- 18. SEVERABILITY: The Agreement is severable and if any provisions of the Agreement are deemed invalid or illegal by a court of competent jurisdiction, the other remaining provisions of the Agreement shall remain valid and enforceable.
- 19. SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY: Notwithstanding any other term or provision in the Agreement, nothing herein is intended nor shall be interpreted as waiving any claim or defense based on the principle of sovereign or governmental immunity or other State or federal constitutional or statutory provision or principle that otherwise would be available to the Owner under applicable law.
- 20. PRE-AUDIT CERTIFICATION: Execution of the Pre-Audit Certification below is a condition precedent to the effectiveness of the signatures set forth below.
- 21. By acceptance of the Agreement, Installer affirms that it is not listed on the *Final Divestment List* and *Parent and Subsidiary List* located at https://www.nctreasurer.com/inside-the-department/OpenGovernment/Pages/Iran-Divestment-Act-Resources.aspx, which was created by the NC State Treasurer pursuant to N.C.G.S. §147-86.58, Iran Divestment Act.

SECTION D: SCOPE OF WORK and PAYMENT AMOUNT

- 1. This Agreement is between Security Camera Warehouse, Inc. a Delaware Corporation, hereinafter referred to as "Installer," and Transylvania County Schools of 749 Pickens Highway Rosman, NC 28772, the legal tenant and/or owner, hereinafter referred to as "Owner."

In consideration of the promises herein, it is mutually agreed as follows:

- 1. The Contract shall be made up of the Installation Agreement, all plans, drawings, schedules and specifications attached to and referenced in this Installation Agreement.
- 2. - 3. ITEMS NOT SPECIFICALLY INCLUDED: Items of work not specifically included in the Scope of Work are not part of the Contract. Work may be added to the Scope of Work and will become part of the Contract only upon execution of an additional written Installation Agreement, signed by Owner and Installer.
- 4. PHOTO RELEASE: SCW reserves the right to take photograph and video of work for marketing and training purposes.
- 5. PARKING, WORK HOURS AND SITE ACCESS: Owner agrees to make available to Installer areas for material and debris storage and areas for staging and working until completion of the Work. Owner agrees to make available daily and/or long-term parking for vehicles that may be used as part of the Work. Installer agrees to work only between the hours of 7:00 AM and 6:30 PM, Monday through Saturday, unless permission to work other hours is given by Owner. Owner shall provide access to all locked areas that require access by Installer. Installer shall not make copies of any keys without the written consent of Owner. Keys and any copies shall be returned at completion.



6. DELAYS IN CONSTRUCTION: Installer agrees to pursue work diligently through completion of the Work. Installer agrees to complete Work within the time limits specified in this Agreement, unless that schedule becomes impossible to follow due to a Just Delay. A Just Delay shall mean any delay due to serious illness, accident, fire, war, riot, lightning, earthquake, poor weather, strikes, theft,vandalism, unavailability of materials, unreasonable delays in delivery of materials, unreasonable delays caused by subinstallers or ancillary trade work, delays caused by inspectors, extra work ordered separate Installation Agreement, extra work ordered by Owner, failure of Owner to make decisions or provide information or access, failure of Owner to make payment, discovery of concealed conditions, filled ground or rock, substandard framing and utilities, out of plumb and out of level conditions, termites and rot, hazardous material, radon, government actions, or other causes beyond Installer's control. Owner shall make no demand for liquidated damages for delays or actual damages for Just Delays.

7. PAYMENT SCHEDULE: Owner shall pay Installer promptly in accordance with the terms set forth below in SECTION D: SCOPE OF WORK and PAYMENT AMOUNT. Timely payment is of the essence.

Prior to commencement of work Installer shall invoice Owner for Equipment total listed in SECTION D: SCOPE OF WORK and PAYMENT AMOUNT payable within 30 days, according to the terms outlined in the separately executed Purchase Order Terms agreement. Installer shall invoice owner for the installation services total listed in SECTION D: SCOPE OF WORK and PAYMENT AMOUNT together with payment for any agreed upon Change Orders upon completion of work.

br />This invoice will be payable within 30 days, according to the terms outlined in the separately executed Purchase Order Terms agreement.

Installer agrees to pay all employees, material suppliers, and subinstallers providing services on this project.

- 8. TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT BY OWNER: Owner may terminate this Agreement for any of the following reasons:
- a. Except in the case of a Just Delay, failure of Installer to perform scheduled Work on the project for a period of ten (10) business days unless the absence has been approved in writing by Owner. b. Except in the case of a Just Delay, failure of Installer to remedy Building Department citations or notices within ten (10) business days unless the delay has been approved in writing by Owner. c. Substantial failure of Installer to satisfactorily comply with the conditions of this Contract. Owner must give ten (10) days written notice of intent to terminate this Contract. During that time, if the grounds for termination are remedied by Installer, the Contract will still remain in force. In the event of termination of the Contract by Owner, Owner shall remain liable to pay Installer for reimbursable Contract costs, including overhead and profit, applicable to all labor, materials and supplies Installer has utilized or ordered for the Work prior to the effective date of termination.
- 9. TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT BY THE INSTALLER: If Owner fails to make any payment within five (5) days of its submittal date, or fails to cooperate with Installer to the point where further project progress is impossible or prohibitively expensive, or unreasonably withholds consent for an amendment in the scope of work necessitated by an instruction or order from a regulatory body or an inspector, or withholds consent to an amendment in the scope of



work necessitated by any of the conditions identified in this Contract, Installer may stop work until problem is resolved or terminate the Contract upon ten (10) days written notice to Owner. In the event of such termination, Owner will be fully liable for the reimbursable project costs related to all of the work actually executed as of the effective date of termination, including overhead and profit. In addition, Owner will be liable for the cost of any reasonable losses caused to Installer because of the termination. Installer will have no obligation to perform further work once termination notice is given, until such time as the problem is resolved. If the problem is resolved before the end of the notice period, this Agreement will remain in force, except that any completion dates will be extended by the number of days between termination notice and resolution.

- 10. TERMS OF ENFORCEMENT: The Contract shall be legally binding on Installer and Owner for themselves, their heirs, executors, successors and assignees. The Contract contains the entire agreement between Owner and Installer, supersedes any and all prior Agreements and understandings between the parties, and may not be changed unless mutually agreed upon in writing by both parties. In the event any provision of the Contract is found legally unenforceable, such unenforceability shall not prevent enforcement of any other provision of this Contract. The Contract shall be governed by the Laws of the State of North Carolina.
- 11. WARRANTIES: Installer will provide a warranty for a period of one (1) year on general construction materials and labor, one (1) year on all third party accessories, and three (3) years on all SCW brand equipment. Installer will not provide any warranty unless all materials, labor and construction items purchased or provided by Installer and invoiced are paid for in full by Owner. The warranty period will commence upon substantial completion of the project. If Owner reports defective materials or workmanship within the specified time period, Installer will repair or replace the problem items, or otherwise remedy the defect, at Installer's option. All other warranties, verbal written or implied, are disclaimed including the implied warranties of the habitability, workmanlike construction, merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose, and in no event will Installer be held liable for incidental or consequential damages or losses.
- 12. LEGAL FEES: If a suit, action or arbitration is instituted in connection with any controversy arising out of the Contract, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the non-prevailing party its costs and reasonable attorney's fees.
- 13. WAIVER OF PERFORMANCE: Waiver by any party of strict performance of any provision of the Contract shall not be considered a waiver of the same provision in the future, or of any other provision.
- 14. DISPUTE RESOLUTION: In the event any dispute or difference should arise between the Parties as to their rights, entitlement and liabilities under any portion of this Agreement, then the Parties agree that their disputes and differences shall be resolved, if possible, without court intervention. As such, the Parties hereby agree that mediation shall be the primary method with which to resolve any such disputes or differences, and the Parties hereby agree to submit any such dispute to a mediator. If such dispute or a portion thereof is not resolved through the primary method of mediation, the Parties agree to submit themselves to the jurisdiction of the North Carolina courts and specifically to the venue of the Buncombe County Superior Court.



- 15. LIENS: Installer warrants that title to each portion of the Work will pass to Owner at the time Installer receives payment from Owner for each such portion of Work. Installer further warrants that upon submitting an invoice for payment, all Work covered by the invoice shall, to the best of Installer's knowledge, be free and clear of liens, claims, security interests or encumbrances in favor of Installer, subinstallers, material suppliers, or other persons or entities making a claim by reason of having provided labor, materials, or equipment relating to the Work.
- 16. AUDIT: The Owner or auditors contracted by the Owner may be given access to persons and records that are generated as a result of, or are related to, the Agreement for purposes of verifying accounts and data affecting fees or performance.
- 17. NORTH CAROLINA PUBLIC RECORDS LAW: Installer acknowledges that the Board is subject to the requirements of North Carolina's Public Records Law ("NCPRL"), N.C.G.S. §132-1, *et. seq.* The Agreement and any related documents, papers, letters, maps, books, photographs, films, sound recordings, magnetic or other tapes, electronic data-processing records, artifacts, or other documentary material, regardless of physical form or characteristics, made or received by the Owner in connection with the transaction of the Agreement may be considered a "public record," subject to disclosure under the NCPRL. The Owner is under no obligation to notify the Installer prior to its compliance with its duties under NCPRL.
- 18. SEVERABILITY: The Agreement is severable and if any provisions of the Agreement are deemed invalid or illegal by a court of competent jurisdiction, the other remaining provisions of the Agreement shall remain valid and enforceable.
- 19. SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY: Notwithstanding any other term or provision in the Agreement, nothing herein is intended nor shall be interpreted as waiving any claim or defense based on the principle of sovereign or governmental immunity or other State or federal constitutional or statutory provision or principle that otherwise would be available to the Owner under applicable law.
- 20. PRE-AUDIT CERTIFICATION: Execution of the Pre-Audit Certification below is a condition precedent to the effectiveness of the signatures set forth below.
- 21. By acceptance of the Agreement, Installer affirms that it is not listed on the *Final Divestment List* and *Parent and Subsidiary List* located at https://www.nctreasurer.com/inside-the-department/OpenGovernment/Pages/Iran-Divestment-Act-Resources.aspx, which was created by the NC State Treasurer pursuant to N.C.G.S. §147-86.58, Iran Divestment Act.

SECTION D: SCOPE OF WORK and PAYMENT AMOUNT

- 1.
