Policy 4326 Random Drug Testing of Students

All students participating in a competitive extra-curricular activity at the middle schools and high schools and/or students issued high school parking permits will be subject to random and suspicionless drug testing. Students participating in extracurricular activities will be subject to random drug testing during the competitive/sports season in which they participate in the activity. Students having high school parking permits will be subject to random drug testing throughout the school year. The test shall detect illegal drugs and other controlled substances in which it is illegal for a student to possess or consume.







Selection of Students

Students selected to undergo a drug test will be chosen at random by the testing laboratory; selection will not be based on any level of suspicion.

When a student has two negative tests during a competitive/sports season, his/her name will not be chosen again while participating in that same activity for the remainder of that competitive/sports season. He/she may, however, be selected during a different competitive/sports season while participating in a different activity. A student having a high school parking permit and not involved in competitive extracurricular activities who has two negative drug tests during a semester will not have his/her name randomly selected again during that semester. His/her name will be eligible to be randomly selected the following semester.



- 541 names submitted- that number varies depending on the sport season
- Historically we test 58 to 60+ students each round, 6 times per year.
- We conduct a 10 panel substance abuse test

2 nd Positive Result	 Contact Parents 14 days out of the extracurricular activity, sport or parking privileges Complete 4 hours of substance abuse counselingwe provide parents with a list of providers. Doctor's release Drug tested the remainder of the testing cycle 	
3 rd Positive Result	 Contact Parent Suspended from all extra-curricular activities for remainder of the school year or 90 days-whichever is longer. Medical doctor's release before competing in any extra-curricular activity or parking privilege 	
4th Positive Result	 Not eligible for parking privileges Banned from participating in all competitive activities 	



Why not test all students in 6-12 grades?

Constitution-



The Fourth Amendment does not allow public schools to conduct random drug testing across the entire student body. However, a school may randomly test students who participate in competitive extracurricular activities, such as athletics and parking.

GS-Chapter 95 Article 20: 230, 231, 232, Regulations-

We follow policy, use an approved lab, and follow procedures.
